RE: Proposition 218 Election Public Hearing and Special Meeting of the Board of Directors

Notice is hereby given that the Panoche Water District will hold a public hearing and special meeting of the Board of Directors at 9:00 a.m. on June 2, 2021. The public hearing will provide landowners with the opportunity to provide testimony on the proposed assessments to fund the District's implementation of agreements with the United States Bureau of Reclamation for water supply and service from the Central Valley Project and conversion of the District's contract as provided for by the Water Infrastructure Improvements for the Nation Act. Ballots that are received by 12:00 p.m., or by the close of public testimony at the public hearing on June 2nd, 2021, **whichever is later**, will be counted.

The meeting agenda will be posted at least 24 hours prior to the meeting at the District's office and web site under Governance/Board Meetings. In accordance with Governor Newsom's Executive Orders N-25-20 and N-29-20 issued in response to the COVID-19 Pandemic, the meeting will be held by web and teleconference, and accessible to the public electronically, through the following means.
